

# BeLoved Knits

Original Knitting Patterns by Katie Ferry

## Ruby



Add a soft touch of color to your hair with a cute knitted headband! Constructed by knitting two i-cords and assembling a knot, this project is fun and quick.

### **MATERIALS:**

- Cascade 220, 100% Peruvian Highland Wool, 100g (3.5oz)/220yd in Ruby (less than one skein)
- 2 Size 8 dpns
- Tapestry Needle
- 1 Skinny Headband
- Hot Glue Gun and Glue

**GAUGE:** not important for this project

**DIFFICULTY:** Easy

**TECHNIQUES USED:** Knitting i cord



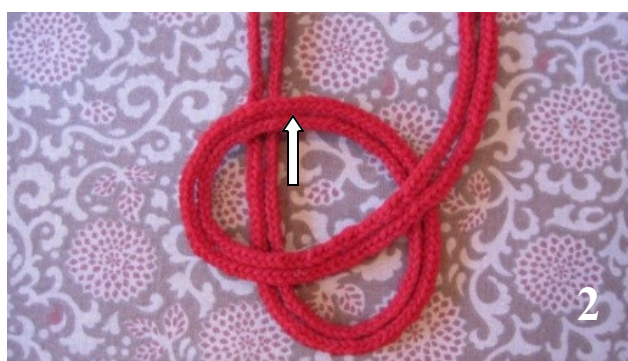
**KNITTING I CORD:** Knit 3 sts, do not turn  
Slide knitted stitches to other end of needle  
Knit the row again  
Continue until cord is the desired length

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

CO 3 sts.  
Knit I Cord until it's 25 inches long.  
Bind Off and weave in ends.  
Repeat for second I cord.

**ASSEMBLING THE KNOT:**

The next series of pictures shows the step-by-step process of creating the knot. Knot should be four inches from one end of the I cord.



Once your knot is assembled, tug at it until it's as tight/loose as you like.

### **FINISHING:**

Next, using hot glue, start at one end and begin gluing the knitted I cords onto your Skinny Store-Bought Headband.

### **Hiding the headband:**

**OPTION A:** You can wrap the headband in yarn, affixing with glue, before you glue the I-cord onto it.

**OPTION B:** Glue additional lengths of yarn to the sides of the headband after you have affixed the I cord.

Once it has dried, you're ready to wear it!

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
